#### Plan for AY 2023 Classes

First of all, we would like to express our gratitude for your continued cooperation in taking infection control measures against COVID-19, which has affected our lives greatly over the past three years.

Recently, the Japanese government decided to downgrade the categorization of COVID-19 to Class 5 under infectious disease legislation, the same status as seasonal influenza, effective May 8.

At Tokyo Tech, we strive to further enhance students' learning, research, and campus activities, and support students in making the most of university life in the "new normal" of the post-COVID-19 era. In this regard, AY 2023 classes will be held in accordance with the following policy and guidelines.

We appreciate your cooperation and understanding.

## 1. Basic policy on AY 2023 classes

AY 2023 classes will be conducted in the following manner.

- In principle, classes are offered face-to-face for both undergraduate and graduate programs, and lecture rooms will be allocated based on their original capacity.
- While placing face-to-face learning and teaching on campus at the center of education, online instruction may be adopted in view of educational effectiveness, on the condition that procedures for quality assurance of education and other related matters are followed.
- Basic infection control measures against COVID-19 will remain in place for classes based on notifications from the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare and the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology or other relevant information.

#### Authorized absences

Eligibility for authorized absences will change due to the downgrading of COVID-19 to Class 5 (common infectious diseases) from May 8.

#### Classes delivered online

Online formats such as livestream, on-demand, and blended formats will be adopted by certain courses when it is determined that online instruction is superior to face-to-face instruction in terms of educational effectiveness.

Undergraduate-level courses will basically be conducted face-to-face except for

- courses that have specific reasons.

  It is stipulated by the Japanese government and Tokyo Tech that "when online teaching occupies half or more of total class hours (counted based on the length of class period) of undergraduate-level courses, the number of credits from those
  - class period) of undergraduate-level courses, the number of credits from those courses ("online courses") that can be counted toward bachelor's degree requirements is limited to 60 in total." The limitation was eased in response to the pandemic, and did not apply to credits attained by the end of the AY 2022 spring semester. However, the limitation will be restored from the AY 2022 fall semester. As such, please remember to carefully draw up your study plan so that total credits from the "online courses" will not exceed 60. Information regarding those courses will be stated on syllabi. The limitation on the number of credits (60) does not apply to graduate degree requirements.
- There may be cases where certain graduate-level courses will adopt an online format
  with a priority placed on face-to-face instruction, decided by committees in charge of
  graduate majors. The decision will be made taking into account such factors as
  educational effectiveness.
- When you need to attend an online class remotely while on campus by accessing a local area network, please bring your laptop or tablet and a headset or earbuds with a microphone. In livestream-format Zoom classes, the instructor may ask students to turn on their webcams, so please ensure that you have one available. It is advisable to charge your laptop or tablet before the class, as each lecture room has a limited number of electrical outlets.
