Advanced Art Workshop B Autumn Semester (1-1-0) (Annually) Susanne Meyer

[Aim and Outline]

What is Nature? How do artists perceived and perceive nature and what modes of expression did and do they find? Autumn Semester (1-1-0) (Annually) Susanne Meyer [Aim and Outline]

In this course the students can experience individual and collective art making for a specific purpose - the stage design for dance-theater with life-music, which will be performed at 20th of January 2016. In this public performance three courses of the CWSC will collaborate. After a short introduction into stage-design we will develop three-dimensional objects within a concept of space, in ongoing communication with the other two courses.
