Application Guidelines for the 2017 Hino Motors Scholarship

Hino Motors, Ltd.

Guided by the Hino Credo and the corporate mission “to make the world a better place to live by helping people and goods get to where they need to go — safely, economically, and with environmental responsibility — while focusing on sustainable development,” Hino Motors maintains harmony between its corporate goals and global environmental protection. Hino Motors also contributes to the economic development of the local communities it serves by developing, manufacturing, selling, and servicing trucks and buses that are safe and efficient.

In addition to its business activities, Hino Motors is also committed to making contributions to society. By placing emphasis on transportation support, protection of the global environment, cultural events and the arts, and providing community support, Hino Motors actively promotes growth in both the local and international communities.

As part of these activities, Hino Motors fosters goodwill between ASEAN member countries and Japan by offering financial support in the form of scholarships through Tokyo Institute of Technology to privately funded, talented students who are preparing to become the next generation of leaders in their chosen fields.

1. Eligibility

- (1) Applicant must be a privately funded student who is a citizen of Thailand or another ASEAN member state (as of October 1, 2017)
- (2) This scholarship is open to all fields of study (However, priority will be given to applicants with an interest in the automotive industry.)
- (3) Applicant must be formally accepted into the master’s program of the International Graduate Program (C) — Overseas Application
- (4) Applicant must be a person with outstanding academic performance and integrity, and truly in need of financial assistance
- (5) Applicant must be 26 years of age or younger on April 1, 2017
- (6) Applicant must be able to participate in the activities organized by Hino Motors listed under Section 9
- (7) Applicant must not receive any other scholarships

2. Number of Recipients

3. Amount and Method of Payment

- (1) Admission fee and tuition
- (2) ¥120,000 in monthly stipend
- (3) After the recipient is chosen, he/she will receive the scholarship, which covers the admission fee, tuition, and stipend, through the institute.

4. Payment Period

As a rule, Two years: beginning October 1, 2017 and ending September 30, 2019
(During his/her master's program)

5. Application Procedure

(1) Scholarship applicants must provide items 1 to 3 listed below to Tokyo Institute of Technology ***with Application Requirements of International Graduate Program (C, Overseas Application)*** by the date specified by the institute.

1. Scholarship application form (in the prescribed format)
2. Pledge (in the prescribed format)
3. Photograph (One 4 cm × 3 cm photograph; write your name on the back and attach the photograph to the scholarship application form.)

(2) After all applications have been submitted through step 1 above, Tokyo Institute of Technology will select one of the applicants and attach a letter of recommendation (in the prescribed format) from that applicant's supervisor or an equivalent figure and send it to Hino Motors by the end of July, 2017.

Application documents will not be returned.

Application documents will not be used for any purpose other than selecting scholarship recipients and implementing, operating, and evaluating the scholarship award system.

6. Selection and Notification of Results

- (1) The scholarship recipient will be chosen by Hino Motors.
- (2) The school will announce the scholarship recipient on or before September 1, 2017.

- (3) If the scholarship recipient has received an (official) offer of a scholarship from another institution or organization, he/she must inform Hino Motors promptly via the institute.

7. Suspension or Termination of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be suspended or terminated under the following circumstances:

- (1) The scholarship recipient ceases to meet application qualifications during the scholarship period.
- (2) The scholarship recipient discontinues his/her studies or program because of sickness, a leave of absence, or some other reason.
- (3) The scholarship recipient exhibits poor academic performance or conduct.
- (4) The scholarship recipient is expelled from Tokyo Institute of Technology or disciplinary measures are taken against the scholarship recipient.
- (5) False information is provided in the application materials submitted to Hino Motors.
- (6) Hino Motors finds that the scholarship is being used inappropriately in terms of the purpose and intent with which it was awarded or in terms of social relevance.

During the scholarship period indicated in section 4 above, if the scholarship recipient has his/her scholarship suspended, he/she may petition through Tokyo Institute of Technology for the renewal of the scholarship after the cause of the suspension is eliminated.

8. Obligations of the Recipient

- (1) The recipient has no obligation to return the scholarship.
- (2) The recipient must submit his/her grades and a report at the end of each semester to Tokyo Institute of Technology.

9. Participation Requirements

- (1) Scholarship award ceremony
- (2) Internship and other events arranged by Hino Motors (about once a year)
