# Report items

# ① Overview of the program and the host university/organization abroad

I participated in the HKUST Entrepreneurship Bootcamp under the AEARU quota. The theme of this year's bootcamp was Advancing Health & Medicine through AI & Technology. It was a week-long program where we learned entrepreneurship skills through lectures and site visits, and applied them to a group project. In our group, people from different universities, countries, genders, and backgrounds worked together for five days. On the final day, we pitched our business ideas, focusing on health problems affecting the elderly or children, with solutions aimed at establishing a startup.

# ② Pre-departure preparation

The program provides transportation, accommodation, and meal coverage upon arrival at Hong Kong airport. We only needed to arrange our own flight and follow the predeparture regulations provided by International Affairs at Science Tokyo, such as processing the application through the school system and purchasing insurance. Other things to consider are currency exchange and a SIM card. I booked the SIM card together with my flight through the airline. Cash in HKD is still needed in some situations, so I used a travel card to withdraw HKD from an ATM in Hong Kong after arrival. This gave a better exchange rate than most money exchange shops in Japan.

#### ③ Academic activities during study abroad: courses, research, etc.

It was a one-week-long workshop, so we mainly followed the arranged schedule. The program focused on embracing entrepreneurship and the steps involved in starting a business — from identifying a problem statement, creating a business model canvas, to wrapping up the project with a time-limited pitching technique. In parallel, we worked on a group project to apply these skills, based on the theme of using AI to address health problems affecting the elderly and children. Step by step, we received constructive feedback from the supervisors and committee.

## 4 Episode in which you experienced personal growth or development

I experience the most growth when facing competitiveness. This involves two key aspects: challenges and rewards. Throughout the workshop, prizes were awarded almost every day in different sections, so I always did my best, with the simple goal of not finishing in last place. I felt pressure working with teammates I had just met, each with different backgrounds, beliefs, perspectives, and working styles. As the group leader, I had to maintain my leadership while also demonstrating creativity, since much of our time was spent ideating and discussing. Reflections from both peers and instructors had a significant impact on me, helping me gain a clearer understanding of my own perspective in comparison to others.

#### **5** Study abroad expenses

A round-trip flight with Hong Kong Express costs around 50,000 JPY. The living cost is similar to Japan, but transportation fees are slightly cheaper than in Tokyo. Public transportation in Hong Kong includes the subway (MTR), buses (Citybus, minibus, Airport Bus), and ferries—all with comparable fares. Since most expenses were covered by the program, I only spent money on personal sightseeing trips. There is generally no consumption tax in Hong Kong, so a tax refund is not necessary.

### **6** Accommodation at the destination

The dormitory at HKUST's Water Bay Campus was provided by the host university. Unfortunately, it appeared to be one of the oldest dormitories on campus, likely due to many summer camps are held at the same time. The rooms were very compact, with two-story bunk beds. Since the campus is located on the easternmost part of the island, it takes more than an hour to reach downtown and about 30 minutes to get to the nearest shopping mall.

The program was conducted in English, but about half of the participants could also communicate in Chinese. Most tourist spots have English information, but some local restaurants may use only Chinese, so it's more convenient to travel with friends who speak Chinese.

# How do you make use of your study abroad experience in your future life?

I had the opportunity to connect with amazing students from top universities. They were all incredibly talented, and I'm grateful to have gotten to know them. Discussing about research projects with graduate students, most of which were related to medical or AI themes, impressed me how diverse the world is and how much more there is to explore. I hope these connections will last and continue to broaden my perspective through their experiences. Personally, I developed valuable business skills, and I believe that having a basic understanding of business is important regardless of the career path I choose. Entrepreneurship and leadership also help build soft skills, which are beneficial in any profession. Additionally, I was introduced to several incubator and venture programs, which will be helpful if I decide to launch a business in the future, as I now have a better idea of where to start.

# **1** Indicate trouble or issues (if any) you experienced during study abroad

Since my passport was valid for less than six months when entering Hong Kong, I consulted with both the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office in Japan and Japan Immigration. I was able to enter without any issues because Thai passports require only 30 days of validity. It is still recommended to apply for a new passport if you have enough time.

#### **1** Advice to other students

The HKUST Entrepreneurship Bootcamp offers valuable knowledge and experience for students who are interested in becoming entrepreneurs—or simply want to understand what entrepreneurship is. No specialized knowledge or prior experience is required to participate. The host university gave their all in accommodating us, and the food in Hong Kong was amazing. Additionally, Science Tokyo provided a study abroad scholarship for qualified students, so if you have the chance, definitely go for it!

# Overview of the program and the host university/organization abroad

The HKUST Entrepreneurship Bootcamp was hosted by the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, HKUST Entrepreneurship Center from 06–12 July 2025. The theme for this bootcamp is related to health and medicine with AI and technology. Throughout the program, interactive lectures and group works were conducted to have us better understand about entrepreneurship and the basic steps of starting a business.

# ② 留学前の準備

All the information regarding studying abroad was kindly provided by the International Division. As for visa, relevant information could be checked through immigration website of Hong Kong, and for my case, visa was not required. Accommodation was directly provided by the host university. After participation was confirmed, person in charge from the Entrepreneurship Center of the host university added all participants to a WhatsApp group for easier communication. Information such as the program flow and shuttle bus pick-up schedule arranged by the host university was sent through email. Prior to the program, I searched for relevant articles, news, research papers, and videos to get myself prepared for the theme.

We had workshops about entrepreneurship, the startup ecosystem in Hong Kong, design thinking, as well as business model and pitching. After the lectures and talks from guest speakers, we had slots for team discussion every day to work on our prototype, business model, and final presentation. We also had games and activities to practice the newly learned knowledge, which I think was very helpful for me to understand the content better.

Besides that, we also had opportunities for site visiting. On the second day of the program, we went to the Lingnan University Jockey Club Gerontechnology-X Lab and we had volunteers and staff explaining about the silver economy (economy by elderly population) and the technologies developed so far to help elderlies live independently. After the final presentation on the last day, we visited the Hong Kong Science & Technology Park to explore different startups and the technologies they are developing. One of the companies we visited was the Hong Kong Center for Neurodegenerative Diseases where breakthrough for Alzheimer's disease was made possible through the big data analysis for blood proteins.

The local participants also kindly showed us around for sightseeing. Other than visiting famous tourist spots, they also brought us to local restaurants to try out authentic local foods. We also interacted with participants from other countries through talks and games to know more about their cultures.

I could speak both so it was not a big problem for me, but I did notice that some international students had a little trouble while the staffs were in a hurry. Therefore, I think that knowing a little about the local language might help with smoother communication, but it is not necessary.
