In cooperation with Imperial College London ("Imperial"), Institute of Science Tokyo ("Science Tokyo") invites student applications for Imperial-Science Tokyo Global Fellows Programme 2025*, a weeklong, training camp-style exchange programme bringing together Imperial and Science Tokyo doctoral students in various fields under the theme of Sustainability Innovation for Food Consumption and Production.

The programme theme will align with the <u>UN Sustainable Development Goal 12</u>, which emphasizes the importance of sustainable consumption and production. Hosted by Science Tokyo, participants will gather in Tokyo to develop the professional, research and collaborative skills necessary to find workable solutions to the problems of SDG 12 and its impacts. Through team discussions and interaction with researchers from different disciplines, development of collaborative research, participation in site visits, and poster presentations, Global Fellows will enhance their leadership and communication skills, further develop their interdisciplinary and intercultural awareness, and build professional networks.

Science Tokyo doctoral students from across the Institute are invited to submit an application.

Eligibility:

- Science Tokyo doctoral students. Students of all nationalities, departments and majors are eligible to apply. The program is not open to those in non-degree or exchange programs at Science Tokyo.
- 2. In principle, applicants should not have participated in the Global Fellows Programme previously.

Selection Process:

Participants will be competitively selected on the basis of their applications. Interviews may be conducted if a large number of applications is received.

Expenses:

Shared twin room at National Olympics Memorial Youth Center will be provided for the duration of the programme. Participants are responsible for meals during the programme and transportation fees, etc., incurred during the field trip.

Course Credit (applied for students of the Science and Engineering schools):

Those selected for the programme should register for **LAH.C618**, **Global Camp 2**. Participants can receive two credits for the course after successful completion of the programme. (Details will be informed when course registration becomes available.)

Other:

English lessons would be offered for those who wish to strengthen their discussion skills in English before the programme starts. The programme participants should participate in post-programme events including a follow-up workshop, debriefing sessions, etc.

■ Research Activities at Imperial

Applicant may stay at Imperial for one to three months, engage in research activities in a laboratory of their choice. Applicant will need to find his/her own host laboratory. Scholarship may be provided.

Duration: 1-3 months between January and June 2026.

Accommodation: Arranged by applicants. All expenses for the short-term research stay are born by applicants.
