

## **Japanese language and culture courses**

Japanese Language and Culture Courses can be recognized as Humanities and Social Science Courses as corresponding 400, 500, and 600-level courses. International graduate students can obtain credits from Japanese subjects upon their successful completion. A research student/researcher may join these classes but cannot obtain credits. Students, however, who earned a degree (undergraduate) at Tokyo Institute of Technology or other universities in Japan and also students who are judged to have higher Japanese abilities can not attend.

## **Reservation and registration procedure for taking Japanese classes**

1. Making an account on Japanese Class Online System: <http://cuckoo.js.ila.titech.ac.jp/~yamagen/regist-h/>

1.1 Students who have already have an account may continue to use the same.

1.2 When you have a NEW or ReNEW Tokyo Tech student ID (i.e., your status changed from a research student to a master student, or a master student to a doctoral candidate), please change your ID number on the system.

2. Logging in Japanese Class Online System and choosing classes that suit your Japanese level. By doing this you make reservations for both the first/third and second/fourth quarter. The available number of seats are limited. When a class has reached the limit, you will be put on the waiting list.

2.1 If it is your first time to take a Japanese class at Tokyo Tech, you need to first take Online Japanese Placement Test to assess your language ability. If you are a true beginner of Japanese or have ever passed the JLPT N1 and N2, you do not need to take the test.

2.2 We strongly recommend you to consult your academic adviser beforehand and gain their consent before registering for Japanese classes.

3. Attending the classes you reserved

3.1 Please **do not miss the first lesson**. Missing your first class will result in your reservation status changed to waiting status even if you have registered the class earlier than other students.

3.2 In the first lesson, the instructor in charge of teaching may assess your level, and if the class level does not fit to it, you may be advised to move to appropriate class, or you are not allowed to attend the class.

3.3 When you are on the waiting list, you **cannot attend the class** until receiving a notification mail message which permits you to attend the class.

4. Registering on Web Services for Student and Faculty (*Kyomu Web System* in Japanese) for credits.

4.1 You need to register it on Web System for Student and Faculty (Kyomu Web System).

4.2 The results will be shown pass or fail. The scores are available on Japanese Class Online System.

5. Registering Japanese Culture and Language (600-level)

5.1 Students who want to register Japanese Culture and Language (600) must reserve one of Japanese language courses which fits to your language level on Japanese Class Online System in advance.

5.2 Students must attend the first lesson and ask the instructor for the permission that you will attend the class as 600-level. With that permission you will be allowed to register Japanese Culture and Language (600-level) on Web Services for Student and Faculty (*Kyomu Web System* in Japanese).
