

# Tohoku Co-learning Camp

Multicultural exchange through agricultural experience and earthquake disaster learning

February 27 – March 1, 2024

International students and local students will visit the Tohoku region and engage in multicultural exchange through agricultural experience and earthquake disaster learning. In Kakuda City (Miyagi Prefecture), you will be exposed to traditional appearance of Japanese farming villages, which are different from those in the Tokyo metropolitan area. You will then visit areas and facilities related to the Great East Japan Earthquake that occurred in March 2011 to learn about earthquakes, tsunami, nuclear accidents, and disaster prevention.

- Program period: February 27 – March 1, 2024 (4 days)
- Activities: Homestay at local families' houses for 2 nights  
Stay at Hotel for 1 night  
Agricultural experience  
Excursions around Kakuda city  
Visit to areas and facilities related to the Great East Japan Earthquake
- Pre-program activities: Guidance and Group work

- Language: English, Japanese
- Eligibility: B2, B3, B4, M1, or M2, Tokyo Tech students
